


## **General Report - HOT Fair Attendees on Oct. 7**


#### Gender and Age



# **Gender of HOT Fair Attendees**

66% of survey respondents identified as female, and none of the respondents preferred to self-identify (N = 47). The average age of respondents was 38 (SD = 16.2, N = 47).






# Ethnic Origin of HOT Fair Attendees

The population of survey respondents (N = 47) was predominantly white (68.7%). Hispanic and Latino attendees constituted the second largest percentage of the sample (19.2%). Black or African American and Asian attendees were the third largest segments (4%).



### Income Level


# Waco HOT Fair Attendees Income Level:



While a majority of respondents (53.1%) made below \$80,000, a large percentage (17%) reported making \$140,000 or more (N = 47).



### Location



The majority of respondents (N = 47) were from Texas (87%), with McLennan County (68%) providing the largest group of attendees.

Within Texas (N = 41), most respondents came from 76708 (20%). Additionally, most people came from Waco (45%), Elm Mott (7%), Hewitt (5%), and McGregor (5%).

Outside of Texas, other respondents came from Oklahoma (3%), Missouri (3%), Minnesota (3%), and Tennessee (3%).
